# History repeats itself Katz resigns

Steve Katz resigned his job as commissioner of the Times Football League, the second time has done so.

TFL founder and two-time commissioner Ken Sain has assumed his duties and will run the league for the rest of this season.

Katz announced in TrashTalk that he was resigning to focus on his education. He is trying to earn certification in the Information Technology field to further his career goals and was concerned he would not be able to devote the time and energy TFL owners demand from their leader.

"Only those who have done it understand what a grind it is," Sain said. "Steve came in when Scott (Lacy) and I were both burned out, and he brought new energy and ideas to the league. For that, we have always been grateful."

That is quite a change from 1996, when Katz resigned the first time only weeks into his first year as commissioner.

That change in leadership became known as the bloodless coup, where it is suspected Sain and Lacy worked behind the scenes to remove Katz from power.

"I have no comment about 1996," Sain said. "That is old news and should remain in the history books."

Katz regained the commissionership at the start of the 1998 season when he ran unopposed for the job.

Most observers believe he has done a good job and received little criticism until

the start of this season. That criticism began after Katz, the Baltimore owner, made a trade that some league owners felt gave an unfair advantage to the Lackawanna Lancers.

But, that criticism had nothing to do with Katz's decision to resign.

"There were some behind-the-scenes discussions, but that mostly had to do with what happens next," Sain said. "Scott and I made it clear to Steve if he wanted to stay, he could."

# Who is the TFL's unluckiest owner?

Ken Sain is convinced that the cosmos are after him. The Sun Devils can't win a championship in any sport, the D-Backs haven't won a World Series in their four-year history, and his Experiments can't find the Sweeney Bowl tournament with a four-game spot and a map.

So it was no surprise when the beleaguered Dugway owner cranked up the Poor-Me Machine on Monday, just 24 hours after the Tubes dropped to 0-3 following a 40-38 loss to Narcoossee. It was the third straight game, Sain pointed out repeatedly, that the Tubes had lost a game in which they scored 38 points or more.

"Woe is me," Sain said Sunday. And again on Monday. And yet again on Tuesday. He was reportedly preparing to say it again as TFL Today went to press early Wednesday.

Does Sain have a case, we wondered? Is it possible that for all the invoking of woe, all the Charlie Brown references, and all the snide references to Prop 5, that he is a man legitimately cursed by fate?

To answer that question, as well as a few others, we scrambled back to the TFL archives to find out whether Sain or any other owner can make such a bold claim.

Turns out Sain was right — sort of. During their league-record nine-game losing streak in 1999, Sain's Experiments lost three consecutive games in which they scored 40 or more points.

But the Experiments can't claim the worst run of luck. That distinction belongs to the Denver Pyles, who in 1999 fell victim to a bout of misfortune that seems almost unthinkable in retrospect. Fighting

for a playoff spot at 5-6, the Pyles entered Week 12 needing a strong finish to make the playoffs.

And finish strong they did, scoring 53, 64 and 42 points in the final three games of the season.

It wasn't enough. They lost all three games.

So that settles the debate over worst short-term luck. But what about bad juju over the course of a career? We scoured the archives for teams that lost games in which they scored 50 or more points and came up with two contenders for the title of Unluckiest in Life.

Not surprisingly, Denver was on this short list as well. Over their 11-year history, the Pyles have lost four games in which they've scored 50 or more points--including one 71-point loss.

But the winner, or loser, is ... Lackawanna. The Lancers have also dropped four 50-point outings, which at first seems not so unlucky when you consider that, unlike the Pyles, the Lancers have no 70-point losses on their resume.

So why is Lackawanna the "winner"? Because the Lancers have compiled four 50-point losses in just four full seasons. That's one heart-breaking loss per season.

And how many 50-point losses does the TFL's Whiniest Man (aka Sain) have?

You guessed it. Zero.

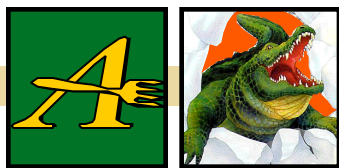

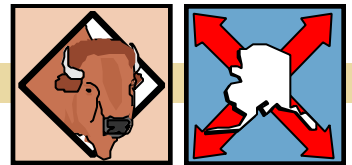

# Sain has busy first weekend

Most people get some time to work their ways into a new job. Not so for new TFL commissioner Ken Sain.

Within hours of regaining the leadership of the league, Sain had to make many key decisions — one which cost his Dugway Experiments a victory on Sunday.

### Tuttell's indecision

First came a scribbled note from Wit Tuttell. It came moments before the games were set to begin Sunday morning. It said something about “maybe, should I, I might want to, but I'm not sure, make a transaction today.”

Wanting to be fair above all else, Sain called Tuttell to get a clarification.

“I think I might want to drop Tiki Barber and add Ron Dayne.”

Well, Sain said, you can do that but you'll have to hurry, the games are about to begin.

What Sain didn't tell Tuttell was Don Carlock had also put in for Dayne and was seconds away from getting him.

“OK, I'll do it,” Tuttell said.

So that's how Tuttell ended up with Ron Dayne and beat Sain's Experiments 40-38. Dayne scored nine points. Barber would have scored six.

“Don't it figure,” Sain said. “You try to do the right thing, and it bites you in the ass.”

The loss gave the Tubes — No. 3 in this week's Power Poll — their third straight loss when they scored 38 or more points.

They are the only team in TFL history to have two, three-game losing streaks when scoring that minimum number of points.

“I really hate that Lucy Van Pelt,” Sain said.

### Trying to get a jump

Next, Sain was faced with a question by a couple of league owners.

Could they submit a transaction before the 12:01 a.m. time slot set

Alaska's Charles Bingham consistently tries to sneak in his requests before everyone else.

Sain decided to allow it, but said all such requests would be timed as having come in at 11:59 p.m.

Tuesday.

“The only advantage anyone could get for turning them in early, is to try to get an earlier time in case that comes into play as a tie-breaker for free agent priority,” Sain said. “By eliminating that, there is no advantage — in fact it could hurt you — so there is no reason not to allow it.”

Long-time rival Chris Reidy hailed the decision as the right thing to do.

However, Tuttell, always the smart ass, tried to kick Sain out of the league.

“Well,” Sain said, “last time I checked Wit had kicked everyone out of the league but himself. I guess that's his plan for winning the T. Rex, because this year's Apes sure aren't going to do it any other way.”

### Katz hits wrong button

The final decision Sain had to make proved to be his most difficult.

Sain received more than 15 T-mails on Monday, most requesting transactions. Eight teams had made requests for moves.

Or, so Sain thought.

At 12:04 a.m. (EDT) he received another T-mail from Baltimore's Steve Katz adding names to his earlier request.

“What earlier request?” Sain thought.

The Barons were not one of the eight teams requesting moves.

Turns out Katz thought he had

sent a T-mail at 5 p.m. with three transactions on it.

Instead of hitting the “send” button, he hit the “close” button. Sain never received his request.

To make things even harder on the new commissioner, Katz had requested the same running back Sain wanted: Michael Pittman. And Katz had priority.

“Do I allow the transactions and give away the running back I wanted? Or, do I not allow it and take the abuse for improving my own team?”

Sain sought advice from former commissioner Scott Lacy.

“Screw Katz,” Lacy said. “He knows the rules.”

After two hours of thought, Sain allowed the transactions to go through. It not only cost Sain Pittman, but also cost Reidy's Ex-Eskimos the services of Priest Holmes, who Sain picked up instead.

“Steve did send me a T-mail timed at 12:04 a.m., only four minutes late,” Sain said. “It was obvious he intended to make a move. It's in the best interest of the league if Steve can improve his woeful team, because at some point we'll all need the Barons to beat another team to help our teams out.

“Also, since we wanted the same player, I didn't want there to be any hint I was ruling against him to help my own team.

“I have no doubt that Michael Pittman will come back to haunt me this week, just like Ron Dayne did last week.”

### Worst of all time

The final decision Sain had to make proved to be his most difficult.

Both Bagdad and Baltimore are on pace to set the record for lowest points scored in a season.

Arctic set the mark with 331 points in 1990. Bagdad is on pace to score 215 points this year. Baltimore is slightly better at 261. Both teams are winless.
