NEWTs TOPPLE RECORD

Two years ago, when the Bagdad Newts rang up 79 points in a game against Dugway, TFL News columnist Jeb Jenco likened the Newts to Mamma Cass, claiming that the team would someday choke itself in its glutinous quest for points.

The Newts continued their gas-guzzling ways on Sunday. Inspired by their quest to beat Narcoossee for the first time, the Newts shattered the TFL single-game record for points in an 86-37 evisceration of the Nose Apes.

The offensive explosion, keyed by Jeff Hostetler's 28-point outing, bettered the previous total of 85 set by the Netherworld Islanders on November 18, 1990—also against the Nose Apes.

"I've topped myself, and that's not easy when you consider the illustrious history of Bagdad football," Lacy said. "If I was Mamma Cass two years ago, then these days I must be a cross between an aging Elvis and Rerun from 'What's Happening'"

Particularly pleasing to Lacy: beating arch-nemesis Wit Tuttell, whose Narcoossee team had compiled a 5-0 career record against Bagdad. So desperate was Lacy to end the skid, he vowed to tattoo "Apes Forever" on his right butt cheek if the Newts lost again.

For now, Lacy's buttocks will remain pristine. But a despondent Tuttell, whose Apes fell to 2-3 on the season, refused to concede Bagdad's superiority.

"Even the biggest losers win one every once in a while," Tuttell said. "Take the Brooklyn Dodgers, for example."

Tuttell, whose Nose Apes haven't made the playoffs since 1991, blamed the loss on the lackluster play of Leroy Hoard, who was promptly cut on Tuesday.

Bagdad's 86-point performance also reaped dividends in the TFL Power Poll. The Newts leapfrogged from No. 13 to No. 3, the largest such jump in the three-year history of the poll.

In other action, the Anchorage Kitchen remained undefeated despite

sputtering on offense in a 16-14 victory over Dugway. It was the second-lowest point total for a winning team in TFL history. The Lincoln Logs won with 13 points in 1993.
