Is luck shining on the Tubes?

First, the Diamondbacks win the World Series.

Now, Ken Sain's Dugway Experiments are off to their best start in franchise history at 5-0.

No wonder there's been no mention of Charlie Brown never kicking the football in the Dumpster.

But, let's look at that 5-0 start. Two weeks ago the Tubes beat Limerick, the preseason favorite to win the Sweeney Bowl.

However, that was the week that the Loons' top pick, quarterback Peyton Manning, did not play because of the bye.

Then this week, the Tubes play Denver on the week their No. 1 pick — quarterback Duante Culpepper — is out with the bye.

To make things even easier for Dugway, Pyles owner Mike Taylor makes the mental fart of the century by starting the backup quarterback for a team also on the bye, Mike McMahon.

Yes, the Tubes have a good team. They have three players ranked among the league's leaders for their positions (QB Brian Griese, RB Priest Holmes and WR Donald Driver).

But they are only ranked No. 4 in the recent Power Poll.

"I've always said it's better to be lucky in this league," Sain said. "Chris Reidy has

done a remarkable job of eliminating skill as a factor. Hey, if the Tampa Bay Loogs are 4-1 and leading their division and the Baltimore Barons can point to two T. Rexes in their trophy case, it's obvious skill can only hurt you."

Sain says the biggest stroke of luck came during the draft.

"For whatever reason, I took Griese in the first round," he said. "I wasn't planning on it. I wanted Deuce McAllister, and I knew Scott Lacy wanted him as well. So, if I didn't take him, Lacy would.

"Griese was available and I grabbed him. Dumb move on my part, because Lacy wasn't taking a QB. He takes

McAllister, and I get stuck with Priest Holmes."

Sain couldn't help smiling at that point. Holmes has become the back everyone thought Marshall Faulk would be this year.

Still, Sain did make some good moves. He recognized the Minnesota offense was not going to be strong after the first week, and dumped WR Derrick Alexander to pick up Donald Driver.

Driver is the only player among the league leaders who went undrafted.

"Yeah, that was a good move, but it was risky at the time," Sain said. "But, when you're the GFFMITG, you just do it." 2 ■ October 9, 2002 TFL Today

Arctic causes slight credibility crisis

Newsletters like this one rely on one ingredient to survive: Credibility.

Without it, no one takes you seriously. (Which explains the drop in circulation during the years Scott Lacy was editor. I mean, Bagdad No. 1 in the power poll every week for three years? Please.)

So the editors of TFL Today became quite concerned when the latest line was released for this week's games.

Lackawanna +26 vs. Arctic. Oh, and the Lancers are the home team.

If anyone would have suggested the Arctic Gators could ever be 26-point favorites over the Lancers, well credibility would have taken a holiday and some would think Lacy had staged a coup and taken control of TFL Today again.

But, most owners are now realizing the Arctic Gators are for real and the team to beat in 2002. Yes, even with Rob Konrad and Jacquez Green on the roster. As long as they don't play, the Gators are the team to beat.

Lackawanna meets Arctic as divisional rivals for the first time this week. It should be the game of the week. Consider:

Both these teams returned to the TFL in 1998 after having played in earlier seasons.

Arctic (5-0) is the perennial doormats. They win their three games each season then sleep through the Pee Wee tourney.

Lackawanna (3-2) doesn't know what the Pee Wee tournament is, having never made an appearance. They have been the most consistent team and own the league's highest winning percentage.

And now, we have a huge role reversal. No one is saying this is a do-or-die game, but it is important. If the Gators win they open up a three-game lead in the Gambell Division. Flint and Marley both stink this year. So, the Lancers are the only team that can possibly slow the Arctic juggernaut.

▶ BEST DUO STARTS: With two teams off to 5-0 starts, some started wondering what is the record for best starts by two teams in a season?

Well, two 5-0 starts isn't that rare. This is the third time since 1998 that

is has happened.

Bagdad and East Hartford both started 5-0 in 1998. The two were scheduled to play in Week 7, so if they both won the following week the league would have its first-ever matchup of unbeaten teams that late in the season.

East Hartford folded under the pressure and lost its Week 6 matchup.

It happened again last season when Denver and Flint both started 5-0. Flint won its Week 6 game, but Denver did not.

However, the record for best start by two teams came in 1994. Flint and Gaithersburg both were unbeaten after eight weeks. Flint was 8-0 on its way to a record 13-0 start. Gaithersburg started 7-0-1. The Garbonzo Beans lost its Week 9 matchup, but gained some revenge. They were the team that finally handed the Flint Bison their first loss.

Dugway and Arctic are not scheduled to play each other this year.

→ MR. CONSISTENCY: Baltimore's Michael Pittman has scored exactly 1 point in each of his five starts this season.

*WORSE TEAM OF ALL TIME: Five games have been played and it is beginning to look like the Flint Bison could be the worse team in TFL history. Don Carlock's team has not yet scored in triple digits. They have 95 points to show for their five games.

The Bison (1-4) have broken the 20-point barrier only once this season. That was a 31-25 season opening victory over Baltimore. Now, Flint is in the midst of a four-game losing streak and on a pace to score only 266 points this season.

If he can reach 300, his team will only be remembered as awful.

The Bison have been hurt by Kurt Warner's disappointing performance before the injury. Still, Carlock has done nothing to improve his team. He did not make a free agent move until this week and appears willing to just write this season off.

What has it come to when the Arctic Gators and Flint Bison have switched roles?
