The Summer's Eve Vinegar Douche Half-ass Awards are a registered

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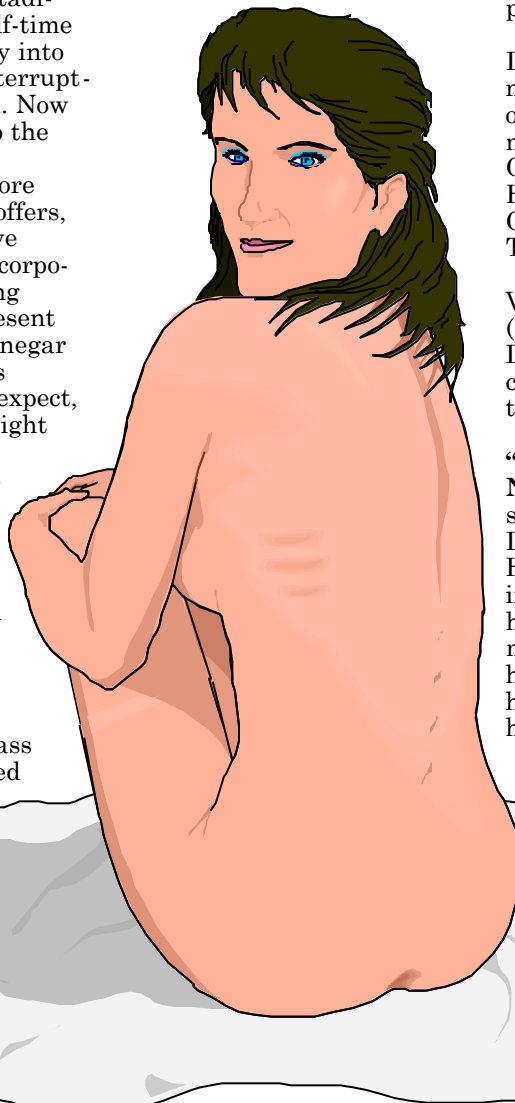

# Barons lose names to climb out of hole

Brady. Brookins. Patten. Canidate. Just one week ago they were nobodies, a tattered band of misfits cobbled together by a desperate Steve Katz.

Around the TFL, the reaction was the same: "Uh — who are these guys?"

Not anymore. The No-Name Brigade is threatening to save the season for the Baltimore Barons. Two weeks after being featured on TFL Today's obituary page, Katz's Barons delivered one of the great performances in league history, crushing East Hartford 73-38.

What made Baltimore's performance so notable? The Barons became just the second team in TFL history to field a lineup in which all seven starters scored six or more points.

The only other team to turn the trick? The 1997 Dugway Experiments.

Baltimore's 73-point outing doesn't even crack the top 10 list of highest team scores, but it's a remarkable accomplishment for three reasons: First, the Barons had the worst record in the league. Second, they were 13th in points scored. And third, the No-Name Brigade — Tom Brady, Jason Brookins, David Patten, and Trung Canidate — entered last weekend with a total of just five career TFL starts.

Naturally, this exceptionally rare performance stoked our curiosity. So we fired up the TFL stat machine in search of similar one-game scoring minutia. Our search covered games dating back to 1992, the year in which individual scoring records were first preserved.

First, we wondered, had any team fielded a lineup in which all seven starters scored two points or fewer? Yep. The 1994 Baltimore Barons, who got two points from Derrick Alexander and one point from

Jerome Bettis in a 54-3 loss to Gaithersburg.

Then we wondered which TFL team had the most starters score 10 or more points in the same game. Here, the 1998 Alaska Oosiks stand alone — six Oosiks scored 10 or more points in an 83-43 victory over East Hartford.

Most 20-point starters in one starting lineup? The 2000 Dutch Harbor Dawgs, who got 25 points from Daunte Culpepper, 23 from Jeff Wilkins, and 22 from Marcus Robinson in an 89-37 win over Baltimore.

Finally, we went in search of a true oddity. Had any team ever fielded a lineup in which all seven players scored the same number of points? No, but Dugway came close. In Week 11 of 1997, six of Dugway's seven starters scored six points; Eddie George, the lone non-conformist, scored nine.

The 2001 Barons, to be fair, have little in common with these last three teams, whose single-game records came in the midst of superb seasons (two were Sweeney Bowl participants, the other the regular-season champion). The Barons, meanwhile, are more likely to go the opposite direction: Brady and Canidate are injury replacements playing on borrowed time, and Patten, a fifth-year player unknown before his four-TD performance two weeks ago, may well be a one-week wonder.

But for one week in 2001, the no-name Barons were the biggest names around.

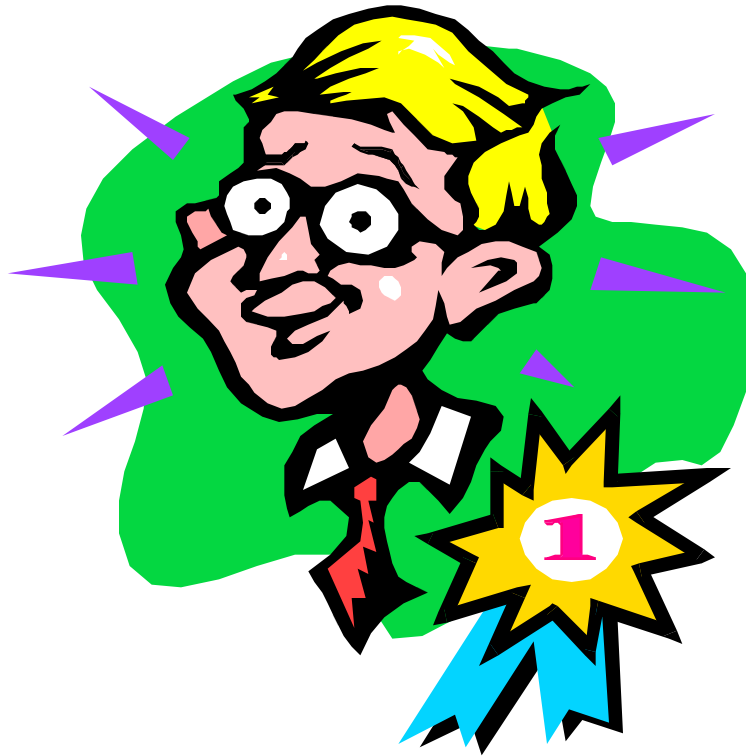
