

Houck leaves in tiff, Ramey takes over


Jeff Houck is gone. Paul Ramey is back. Scott Lacy is pouting. Ken Sain is baiting people. Chris Reidy isn't talking.

OK, that could describe almost any week in TFL history. But

there was never a week like this past one.

Tampa Bay owner Jeff Houck gave away his franchise to Paul Ramey after an uproar by Sain and Lacy over his management of the Loogs last week.

Tampa Bay lost to undefeated Arctic 35-27.

And they only loss by 7 points.

"Yeah, that bothered me," Commissioner Ken Sain said. "That game meant something to a lot of other teams, not just the two involved.

"Do you think the NBA would ever allow any of its teams to tank it and let a team in contention get an easy victory? When Houck admitted he intended to tank it, well, he deserved to be criticized."

Houck felt differently.

He believes that he paid his franchise fee and should be able to manage the team any way he wants, including setting it up to lose.

So, he said he was done with the TFL and would find someone else to run the franchise.

But that's when the fighting really began. Some of the other TFL owners tried to play peacemakers and defended Houck's desire to run his franchise as he saw fit. Most outspoken were East Hartford's Chris Reidy, Limerick's Michael Bourque and Narcoossee's Wit Tuttell.

Lacy took their lack of support personally threatened to end all of his involvement in the management of the team, which even his loudest critics admit is

considerable.

Finally, Houck left. Lacy and most of the other owners reached an accord. The only one who has been silent is East

Hartford's Reidy. He has boycotted TrashTalk since Houck's departure and the ensuing shouting. He even ignored many taunts that Sain threw out, trying to bait him back into the dumpster.

Faced with an owner dumping his team at midseason for the first time ever, TFL owners reached

consensus on allowing Houck's designated choice — Ramey — to run his team for the rest of the season.

The two agreed to split evenly any money made if the Loogs go on to reach the playoffs. Ramey has played in only one TFL season before — 1991, when he led the Hogtown Halibut to a Sweeney Bowl victory over Narcoossee.

"I'm just honored to have the opportunity to coach in this great league again, and I really mean that," Ramey said. "It's been a long layoff, and the play book is a little dusty, but I don't think it will take long to get back into the swing of things. I would have preferred to inherit a little stronger line up, but I guess that's the way it goes. My only disappointment is that I just missed an opportunity to beat Coach Dolan's Arctic ass. He thinks he knows whupass? I can only hope that we'll meet again in the playoffs. I'll show him what a real ass whupin'feels like."

▶ **RECORD STREAKS:** Arctic and Dugway both won again, improving to 8-0 for the season. Both now have the second-longest winning streak in TFL history. Flint opened the season 13-0 before losing in 1994.

Both teams will try to extend their streaks and sweep their conferences with wins this week. They could be important games because having a win over each of their conference foes will give them a tiebreaker edge.

Arctic is favored over Willow, but it is unlikely Dugway will beat East Hartford. The Experiments must play without Priest Holmes and Brian Griese, who rank No. 3 and No. 4 overall in TFL scoring this season.
