It ain't poetry, but it's progress

Ex'mos wake up sleepy New England town, keep flickering flame alive

HEBRON - November, you might say, is the "bad hair day" of autumn in New England. The brilliant foliage that made October so memorable is now only to be found at the end of someone's rake, leaving behind gnarled naked trees. And the snows of December, which make for those picturesque beer commercials during Christmas, are still a month away.

And yet, the residents of this small Connecticut burg have awakened today to find an encouraging November sight: Their Ex-Eskimos are, unbelievably, back in the playoff hunt.

"It's been hard not to give up on the season," East Hartford owner Chris Reidy said at his weekly press conference.
"For the last four weeks, we've been one loss away from me chucking the whole year in the dumpster.

"But now, there's at least reason to hope."

The Exmos' newfound optimism has been fueled by a three-game winning streak that has helped turn an 0-4 start into a 4-5 record. It certainly didn't hurt morale, either, that the latest victory was a 47-31 disproving of the arch rival Dugway Experiments.

"Heh-heh, I knew someone was going to ask me about that," Reidy said. "Yeah, it never hurts pinning another 'L' on Mr. Sain. Then again, I'm not even sure Kenny realizes he lost yet."

The Experiments have been placed in a blind trust while Sain, their owner, runs for Congress. Since he is also simultaneously campaigning to win George W. Bush the presidency, Sain could not be reached for comment. But an official at his campaign headquarters issued the following statement: "Woe is me."

The Exmos' victory was important on other fronts. East Hartford joined a six-team group at 4-5, just a half-game out of a wild card berth. The Exmos now own victories over two of those teams, Dugway and the Anchorage Kitchen, setting them in good position if a tiebreaker is needed.

"No doubt about it, this week's game might be the biggest of the season," Reidy said of the Exmos' impending matchup with the Arctic Gators. "To break even after 10 games would leave us right in the thick of things."

And though the Gators are struggling at 3-6, Reidy said the Exmos aren't about to take anything for granted. No doubt, he hasn't forgotten how the Gators spoiled East Hartford's shot at the Triple Crown in 1998 with a 56-27 ass-biting in the season finale.

"No, those Gators can be tough," Reidy said. "Hey, everybody's talking about them."
