Quiet Rivals

Flint, Lackawanna battle behind the scenes

They are the only two current TFL franchises with no direct ties to the Anchorage Times. Perhaps that commonality is one of the reasons the Flint Bison and Lackawanna Lancers have the greatest rivalry nobody's talking about.

But the secret may be out. Those two teams are 8-1 going into this week's matchup. Considering the impact of the ill-advised Prop. 5, the winner of this week's game will have essentially a two-game lead in the Kotter Division with four games to play.

Not much is riding on the outcome. Only the Kotter Division title, a potential regular season crown, and the all-important Week 15 bye in the playoffs.

"I am not foolish enough to think my team is better than theirs, but i believe (Bison QB Duante) Culpepper is still sitting on a game to go crazy," Flint owner Don Carlock said. "With any skill/luck, that will happen this week against the Lancers."

Lancer co-owner Mike Continelli said Carlock has had more than his fair share of luck, especially this year.

"Forget about carrying a rabbit's foot, just give me a



wallet size picture of Carlock," Continelli said. "His clover has eight leaves.

"When a team has only a plus-9 scoring differential, you would expect maybe a winning record, but 8-1?"

These rivals have been butting heads since the start. They both came into the league in 1994. The Lancers had a tremendous season, going 10-4 and breaking the points-scored record.

One problem. That was the year Flint won its first 13 games to finish 13-1 and claim the regular-season title

Continelli marveled then at how the Bison always managed to score just enough points to get the victory.

He's even more amazed this season.

"We feel confident about our team, but it makes you wonder," Continelli said. "If we score 10, will he have 11? If we have 75, will his team total be 76? ... It is uncanny."

After the 1994 season the Lancers disbanded for three years and returned in 1998. Lackawanna has claimed the last two Kotter Division titles. But, the rivalry really

picked up this summer.

The Brothers Continelli made a trade with Baltimore owner Steve Katz — now simply known as "The Rape." It was Carlock, who knew he'd have to beat his division rivals, that pointed out the implications of that trade to the rest of the league.

"In regards to the Katz rape, I did some further investigating and found that the reason the Brothers were no prosecuted is that Steve Katz would not file charges," Carlock said. "After interviewing Katz, the investigator seemed to think there was enjoyment by all parties."

Another factor adding to this quiet rivalry is the Brothers Continelli feel slighted by the rest of the TFL owners, while they believe Carlock is beloved.

"Donny is a class act and attends every convention, which obviously elevates him to the highest form of being on the planet," Continelli said.

And despite this weekend's outcome, this rivalry should only get better. Both teams are slated to share the same division in the realignment.

"I would prefer not to see them in my division in the future," Carlock said. "They always field a strong team, I say throw them out of the league — just kidding. I am very excited about this weekend's matchup. Let's get it on!" Page 2 ■ TFL Today Wednesday, Nov. 14, 2001

Inside the numbers

Looking for close calls and blowouts

Last week we had a dilemma. An alert reader tipped us off to a pair of statistical oddities that required our exploration, but we had just one column in which to explore them. So we wrote about one, filed the other away for later.

A good thing we did, because tonight we were fresh out of ideas.

The leftover oddity? Our alert reader, owner Ken Sain of Dugway, noted that all of the Week 8 games had been decided by a margin of 13 points or greater. Had that ever happened before, Sain wondered? He turned to us — as anyone would — for answers.

So we took Sain around back and turned the crank on the TFL's number-crunching machine. And we found out that, yes, it had happened once before: Week 5 of the 1997 season.

Satisfied, Sain left. But we were still thinking about things — as we often do. So we turned the crank a few more times.

First, we wondered about the closest week in TFL history — that is, which week featured the most nipand-tuck tilts in league history? Of course, there are several ways to interpret that question, and so we went at it a couple of different ways.

We started by searching for weeks in which all the games were decided by 10 points or fewer. Much to our surprise, there were none. We wound up incrementing the margin of victory several times before we hit paydirt. In the end, we found that the tightest week in TFL history was Week 14 of the 1995 season, a week in which all seven games were decided by 16 points or fewer.

But was that really the most competitive week in league history, or merely a week with no blowouts? To be certain, we searched for the week with the lowest average margin of

victory. Once again, we came up with Week 14 of 1995 — the average margin of victory that week was just over four points per contest.

Week 14 of the '95 season was indeed a remarkable week: two games ended in ties, and three others were decided by four points or fewer.

Back to blowout weeks. As we mentioned earlier, Week 8 of this season was only the second week in league history in which the winning margin was 13 points or greater? But which week featured the greatest average winning margin?

That would be a cold early morning in Anchorage — Week 1 of the 2000 season to be exact. Led by Narcoossee's 84-11 rout of Bagdad, that week's games were decided by an average margin of 29 points.

Dolan causes international incident by firing coach

In a move that has shocked the sports world and caused concern on the international political front, Arctic Gator Owner/
Manager Mark Dolan has fired assistant coach Sven Gorn Erikkson and asked him to remove his personal belongings from the Gators front office headquarters located in the posh Notting Hill area of London.

Erikkson, head coach of England's World Cup team, expressed disappointment and surprise but seemed resigned to the decision.

"The Arctic Gators record is obviously embarrassing and I understand the disappointment and concern amongst the fans and the team ownership," Erikkson said. "But I never claimed to be an expert on American football and I did the best I could. I think Mr. Dolan could have handled the whole thing much more diplomatically."

Dolan spoke about the matter to the American press for the first time Monday shortly after his team's matchup with the Denver Pyles. "Of course I am sorry this has caused so much commotion in the political arena at a time like this," Dolan said. "But, even more than that, I'm embarrassed by the fact that the situation has gone on as long as it has."

Dolan explained that despite the fact that the world famous Times Football League is in its ninth week of competition, he only realized this week that Erikkson has virtually no experience with American-style football.

"When I came to London for an infusion of talent and ideas, Sven's name consistently came up as England's greatest football strategist," Dolan said. "Of course I was excited to add him to the team, both for the sake of giving us a competitive edge as well as for the opportunity to contribute to positive American/Brit relations.

"It wasn't until Tony Blair invited me to watch England vs. Sweden in the World Cup qualifying match Saturday that I realized they're not playing football at all — it's soccer," he proclaimed, the exasperation obvious in his voice.

Dolan, who has often been criticized by other TFL owners for his lack of attention to the details of his team's performance, was visibly chagrined by the situation.

"Of course I'm incredibly embarrassed to only realize now the huge mistake I have made," Dolan said.

"Of course I wish this had come to light in the beginning of the season. But at this point I just have to deal with it, and do what I can to win some games in the time left and try to salvage

the rest of the season. I think this is the right thing to do for the team and the fans. I am sorry if that upsets Tony Blair and Colin Powell, but I think they need to chill out" he added.

Dolan was referring to comments made by both of the politicians in the wake of Erikkson's ousting.

"This is a regrettable situation," Powell said. "I think this is the time for all Americans to do what is best for our country and put their own selfish needs second. England has been our staunchest ally in the war on terrorism and I want to assure the Prime Minister and the British people that the actions of the Arctic Gators management do not at all reflect the strong feelings of friendship the American people have for the people and government of the United Kingdom."

British Prime Minister Tony Blair said he appreciated Powell's comments but still expressed outrage over Dolan's actions.

"I'm quite happy indeed to hear the official position of the American government as stated by Colin Powell," Blair said from his office at 10 Downing Street. "But this is a slap in the face to the British people, isn't it? You can't just fire one of our greatest sports figures, insulting him and the British people and think an apology will make everything okay. It's not cricket, is it?" he added.

When asked about the incident at the White House during a press briefing, President Bush said the situation called for stern measures and was looking into actions that could be taken against Dolan and possibly the TFL.

"I have asked the Attorney General to look into possible sanctions that may be taken against Dolan," The President said. "We will bring all the power and might of the federal government to bear to see that he is properly punished. I would hope the other owners of the TFL will do what's right and take proper action of their own. If they do not, I assure you when the time for action comes, we will not differentiate between those who insult our allies and those who harbor them," he added.

"But let me get one thing straight," the President asked the press. "Do the British people play football or not?"

TFL founder and current commissioner Ken Sain released this statement over the incident.

"Mark Dolan seems to think saving coaches even at the expense of an international incident will salvage his season. It's like Bruce Ismay changing captains after the Titanic has run into the iceberg."
