Inside the numbers Getting the most out of entire roster

t was a typical week in the TFL: Ken Sain conceded his game at 1:01 p.m. on Sunday, the Pyles stared wistfully at the Newts' ATWO crown, and Charles Bingham itemized his team's performance to the utter indifference of TrashTalk readers worldwide.

In concluding his weekly report, Bingham couldn't help but cluck: "That's right folks, the Eagles defense scored 15 points for me today."

There were vawns all around. But down here in the bowels of the TFL Archives, where we're always on the alert for the statistical minutiae, Bingham's post caught our attention. In reviewing his team's performance, we noticed that the Oosiks D not only popped for 15 points, it also outscored every other player on his team.

When was the last time that happened, we wondered? So we fired up the TFL Stat Machine in search of the answer. Turns out it's happened twice this year and 35 times in TFL history.

Not an everyday occurrence to be sure, but not an exceedingly rare one either. And that's why we comb the record books in the wee hours of the morning — to find something rare. So we upped the ante. Had any TFL team's defense outscored the rest of the team *combined*?

Surprisingly, that's happened twice. The first recorded occurrence was Week 9 of 1992, when Dugway got eight points from the Chargers defense — and six points from the rest of the team. Amazingly, the Tubes won that game, 14-9 over **Dutch Harbor**

It would be eight years before it happened again. The Bagdad Newts got six points from their defense, five from everyone else, in the season opener against

Narcoossee. This time, it was nowhere near enough — the Nose Apes won 84-11.

All this made us wonder about what positions lead their team in scoring most frequently. So we scoured game summaries going back to 1992 and determined, percentagewise, which positions most frequently led their teams in scoring:

- 1. Quarterbacks: 37 percent
- 2. Running Backs: 21 percent
- 3. Kickers: 21 percent
- 4. Wide Receivers: 19 percent
- 5. Defenses: 2 percent

We were a bit surprised to see that quarterbacks comprised less than 40 percent of the high scorers, and that defenses were as high as 2 percent. But the numbers don't lie — two of this season's 70 games have been decided by defensive points. That's three percent of all games this season.

Just goes to prove that, despite the TFL's traditional bias toward quarterbacks, a Sweeney Bowl team needs a few other great positional players in the mix. And a productive defense doesn't hurt.

But even if you can't count on your quarterback, or your defense, there's one thing you can always count on:

Charles Bingham will let us know who's scoring what for the Oosiks ---week, after week, after week.


