Exmos gobble up 11th 'W,' babeeee

Over the river and through the woods, to the playoffs we go

HEBRON, Conn. -- It was a game worthy of one of the TFL's great regional rivalries. And it spurred the winner to new heights.

The Limerick Laughing Loons, with a chance to cut into East Hartford's lead in the Kotter Division, proved they were no sitting ducks. With John Elway back in the lineup, the Loons put a solid 47 points on the board, taking a 20-point lead over the Ex-Eskimos with only two East Hartford players remaining.

But those two players helped put the Ducks on ice. With Steve Young and Ben Coates combining for

40 points in the Sunday-Monday night games, the Exmos stormed back for a 67-47 victory that clinched their third division title since the TFL went to a divisional format in 1993.

The Exmos also im-

proved to 11-1, tying them for second-most wins in a TFL season, and joined another elite list: The 600 club. Coates' 11-point performance Monday night gave East Hartford 609 for the season, sixth-most in TFL history. Only seven teams have reached that plateau in the five seasons in which points totals are available.

"No question about it, the Loons spurred us to greatness," owner Chris Reidy said Tuesday at his weekly press conference. "I was perhaps more worried going into this game than I had been in any other since

playing Bagdad in Week 7.
Most of the league hadn't seen

Indeed, the two teams have had quite a few battles, dating to 1992, the year both joined the TFL. That season finished with the then-Scarborough Stunting Ceasars beating the West Hartford Ex-Eskimos in

an all-expansion Sweeney Bowl. It would be the first of two titles for Mike Bourque, the only TFL owner to claim that distinction.

The two teams have been rivals in the TFL's toughest division ever since.

"Yeah, we've been through the Kotter wars together," Reidy said. "We've both got our share of scars. I was fortunate to come out ahead in this skirmish."

The playoff mish-mosh

If the season ended today – which it doesn't, but everybody loves to say that – here's how the playoff seedings would shape up. Anybody got a calculator? Good, you don't need one. Or much of a memory.

No. 1, East Hartford, 11-1.

No. 2, Alaska, 9-2-1.

No. 3, Bagdad, 9-3

No. 4, Limerick, 8-4.

No. 5, Lackawanna, 7-5.

No. 6, Narcoossee, 6-6

Anything could still happen. Alaska and Bagdad could tie, but Alaska won their meeting, so they'd maintain second seed.

Alaska and East Hartford could still tie, and Alaska won their meeting, so Alaska would take over No. 1 seed.

Bagdad and East Hartford can still tie, and East Hartford won their meeting. The only possible tie there would be for both teams to end up 11-3. If they did and Alaska ended up 11-2-1, Alaska would get No. 1 seed, since they had beaten the Exmos and Newts. Bagdad would stay third, having lost to both of those teams.

Limerick and Bagdad could finish tied, and they play this week, so that's hanging. Lackawanna and Bagdad could still tie. That would go to Bagdad, and would make them either No. 3 or 4, depending on whether Limerick, which could also finish 9-5, does this week.

A Limerick-Lackawanna tie in records would go to Limerick. Narcoossee? Who cares.
