High School: Beverly Hills High School

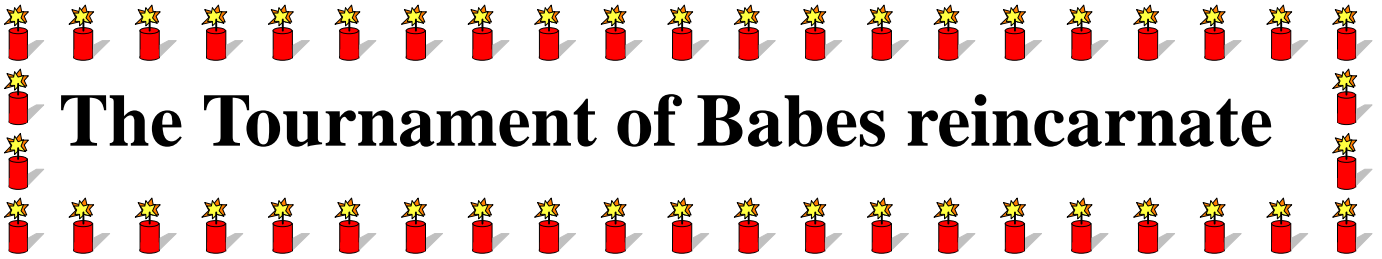
Ethnic background: Russian, French and Dutch

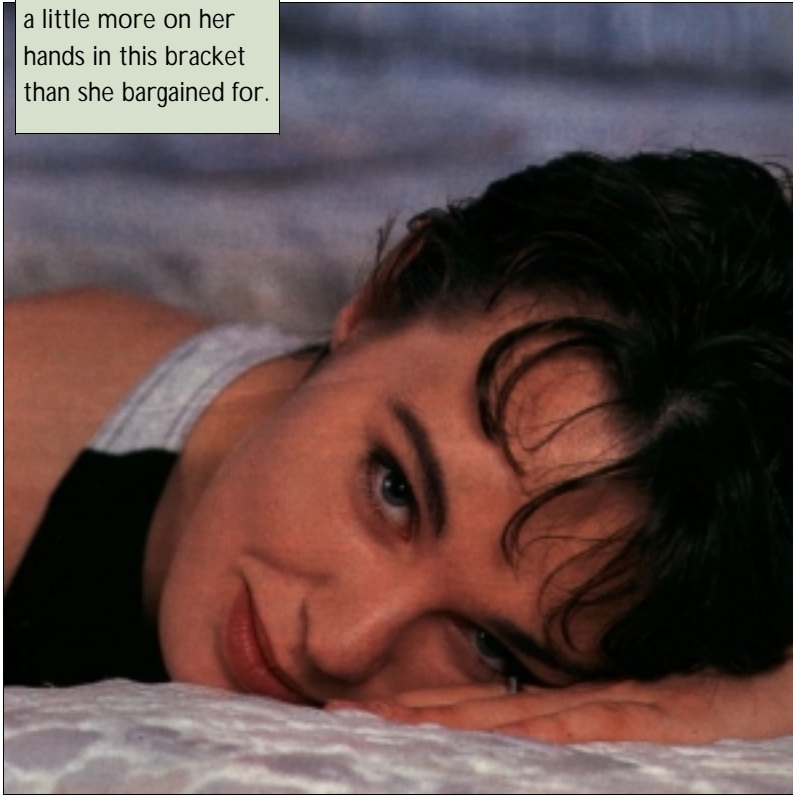

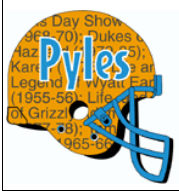

Denver (5-6) at Flint (3-8)
Line: Even

"It's all luck, anyway, and anybody who thinks otherwise is fooling themselves," Don Carlock said in explaining why he left an inactive Akili Smith in the lineup last week. If Denver still has enough gas for a playoff push, now's the time.



Limerick (3-6-1) at Dutch Harbor (6-5)
Line: Dawgs -3

Dutch Harbor must simply finish with a better record than Baltimore to make the playoffs, although no other type of scenario should really be considered too remote. Such as the fact that they own a tie-breaker over Anchorage.



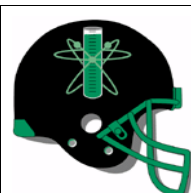
Bagdad (4-6-1) at Anchorage (6-5)
Line: Bagdad - 4

Baltimore (6-5) at East Hartford (7-4)

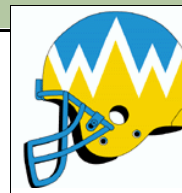
Dugway (4-7) at Arctic (2-9)

Line: Even
