Holmes takes anger out on rest of TFL

Dugway running back Priest Holmes was angry after he looked at the TFL draft list.

"I went in the second round?" he asked. "What the fuck? Did I lead the NFL in rushing in 2001, or was that all a dream?"

It wasn't a dream. And Holmes is leading the NFL in rushing again this year, but that's only the start. He has taken his anger out on other TFL owners and rewarded Tubes owner Ken Sain with what could be the best season by a running back in TFL history.



Holmes

Holmes has scored 169 points in his 11 games to date. That places him third in TFL history. He is only 18 points behind the record, set by Alaska's Terrell Davis in 1998.

Holmes had three touchdowns and rushed for 197 yards last week in a 30-point game. He has scored 21 or more points in five of his 11 games this year. Holmes has scored in all 11 games and has scored seven or more points in 10 of his 11 games.

TFL owners may want to draft him early next year just to keep him from getting angry and taking it out on their teams.

► **CHASING RECORDS:** The Tampa Bay Buccaneers are also chasing the best season in TFL history in their category. The Dutch Harbor defense has 53 points, only one point behind the Broncos defense that set the record in 1997 for the Denver Pyles.

The Bucs have put the Dawgs in position to win their third points scoring title in six years as well. Dutch Harbor, 597 points, leads the points scored race by 39 points with two games to play.

Arctic, which at one point was on a pace to score more than 900 points this season, are not 63 points out of first place. Marley's record of 722 points scored in 1995.

The record for points in a season by a receiver could be threatened by a couple of good weeks. The record is 137 points by Herman Moore in 1995.

Notebook

Marvin Harrison and Terrell Owens both have 113 points with two games to play. Hines Ward is also in the race with 112 points.

It would take unbelievable efforts for either the quarterback and kicker season records to fall. East Hartford quarterback Rich Gannon (191 points) needs 75 to match Steve Young in 1998.

Bagdad's Martin Gramatica has 98 points, 51 points behind the all-time best by Chip Lohmiller in 1991.

The oldest record in the TFL books is safe for another season. Arctic has held the record for

fewest points scored in a season by one team since the first season in 1990 with 331 points. Marley has now scored 342 points after last week's big effort to avoid that potential embarrassment.

► **SPENARD SILLINESS:** The four teams in the Spenard Division have played 12 games each, and decided very little. All four are 6-6 and in position to win the division.

Or, finish last in the division.

The head-to-head matchups of the new format means that all four teams are in control of their own destiny. Win the next two games, and they're in good position to make the playoffs.

Lose, and the reverse is true.

Dutch Harbor and Anchorage had the tie-breaker edges.

► **LACKAWANNA COMEBACK:** At one point this season it appeared that one of the most amazing streaks in league history was going to end.

Lackawanna has made the Sweeney Bowl Tournament in each of their five seasons, the only team to ever do that. They have never played in the Pee Wee Bowl Tournament.

After a 3-3 start this year, the Lancers didn't look like a playoff team. However, the pickup of quarterback Chad Pennington has sparked the Lancers and they are in position to make the playoffs.

All they must do is win their remaining two games, and they're in. They could even end up as the top seed in the Cheechako Conference.



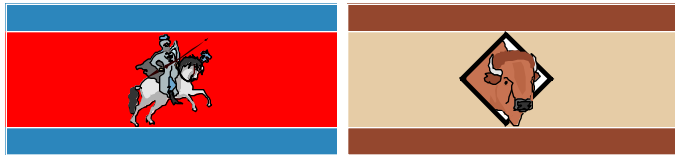

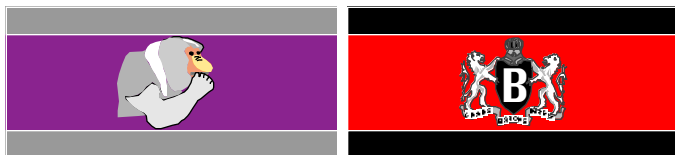
Dutch Harbor at Tampa Bay

Prediction: Narcoossee 38, Baltimore 33.



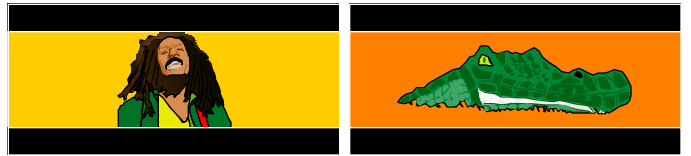
Bagdad at Dugway

Prediction: Dugway 49, Bagdad 48.



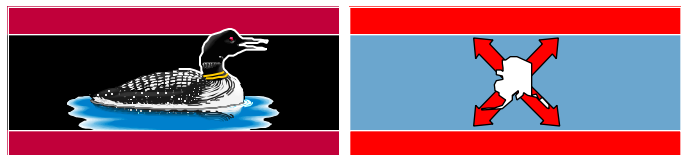
Anchorage at Willow

FIREWEED

Dugway

The Experiments have clinched the division title and top seed in the Sourdough Conference. The only thing to play for is the regular-season title. Their only competition are the Gators. One win and an Arctic loss locks it up.



MULDOON

East Hartford

The Ex-Eskimos are in the best position to win this division. They own the tie-breaker edge over Baltimore. If the Barons win the division, they must finish better than Alaska in wildcard race. But they do own Bagdad.



SPENARD

Dutch Harbor

The Dawgs will win this division if they win both remaining games. But, the same can be said for the other three teams. The Dawgs do own a tie-breaking edge over Lackawanna if they end up tied with the Lancers.



GAMBELL

Arctic

The Gators clinched a playoff spot despite losing last week. They can clinch the top seed in the conference with one win, or a Lackawanna loss. Even then, if they teams are tied, Arctic currently owns points scored tie-breaker.



Alaska

The Oosiks are in a four-way tie for a wildcard playoff berth. If Baltimore wins the Muldoon, then the Oosiks are in great shape. If Alaska and Baltimore tie for wildcard, the Barons own the head-to-head tie-breaker.



Baltimore

The Barons have no business being in a playoff race, but here they are. Their best hope is to win out and pray the Ex-Eskimos lose at least once. If they battle for the wildcard spot, they only own an edge over Bagdad.



Anchorage

The Kitchen can win the division, the wildcard spot, or miss the playoffs altogether. And all three can happen even if they win both remaining games. It depends what other teams do. But winning both games is key.



Lackawanna

The Lancers loss to Marley may have killed them. They need to start scoring lots of points and hope Arctic loses this week to win the division. If they win at least one game, they could earn the wildcard berth. They can't lose both games.



Bagdad

The Newts are in trouble. Losing to Alaska means that the four teams they are tied with all own a tie-breaking edge over Bagdad. They need to win out, then hope the other three all suffer at least one loss in their remaining games.



Limerick

All Limerick has to do is win both remaining games and the Loons win the division. They will have swept the two teams they would likely be tied with for the division title. If they lose a game, say hello to Pee Wee.



Willow

The Weasels win the division by winning the two remaining games. Period. If they don't win both, they must hope Lackawanna loses at least once to have any hope of earning the wildcard berth, since they have that edge.



Flint

Flint has no chance of making the Sweeney Bowl tournament. They are playing for the Pee Wee tourney and avoid the humiliation of missing that. They just need one victory in their two games to do that and advance.



Denver

The Pyles are still alive, but not by much. They must win both games and then hope all four teams at 6-6 lose at least once just to force a tie-breaker. They own edges over all but East Hartford and Alaska. So, they must beat Oosiks.



Narcoossee

The Grape Apes are having a tough year. And, it could get even worse. If the playoffs were today, the Apes wouldn't qualify for the Pee Wee Tournament. They can make that, but must win out and hope Flint loses both games.



Tampa Bay

The Loogs can win the division by winning both games and hoping Willow loses at least once. They have the tie-breaker against Lackawanna if Willow wins the division. If they lose once, they're Pee Wee bound.



Marley

The Wailers will be one of two TFL teams not to advance to a postseason tournament for the first time since the Pee Wee came along. Well, there's a slim chance they can avoid it, but it's so unlikely they should reserve tee times.
