# Dawgs bite Tubes! Brogan gets point

## Dutch Harbor slips past Dugway

Did you see that meaningless touchdown Dorsey Levens scored in the final two minutes of the Green Bay-Minnesota game on Monday night?

He scored on a run after the Packers had already locked up a victory over the rival Vikings. Well, it was meaningless in the TFL.

That run cost Dugway's Ken Sain the points scoring title and a chance at the triple crown.

Dutch Harbor slipped past Dugway with 617 points to claim their first lead in the points derby this season. Since it was the final week of the regular season, it gave Casey Brogan his first points scoring title and an additional five percent of the pot.

Dugway finished with 613 points in the closest points scoring finish in league history.

"I can't complain," Sain said. "Casey's team scored 128 points in the final two weeks of the season, so he did what he had to do to win it. My team

has been struggling for about seven weeks now. Looks like Casey is the favorite to win the T. Rex."

Joining Dutch Harbor and Dugway in the Sweeney Bowl Tournament are Kotter Division champ Flint, and three wildcard teams: Denver, Baltimore and East Hartford.

The Ex-Eskimos lost to Denver in the final game, but Alaska's victory over Willow put East Hartford into the playoffs. Five of the Ex'Mos eight wins this year came when they scored 31 points or less.

"When (Ex'Mos owner) Chris Reidy quits screaming about how he got screwed by the tiebreaker, someone tell him he's in," Sain said.

# Dawg gone (and done) it

## Dutch Harbor favorite to win the T. Rex trophy

Four of the six teams in the Sweeney Bowl Tournament have played in the league's championship game before.

Three of the six have set the league's top three regular season records during their careers.

And two of the six are making their third straight appearance in the Sweeney Bowl Tournament.

And only one team has done all of the above.

Let's fill in the blanks.

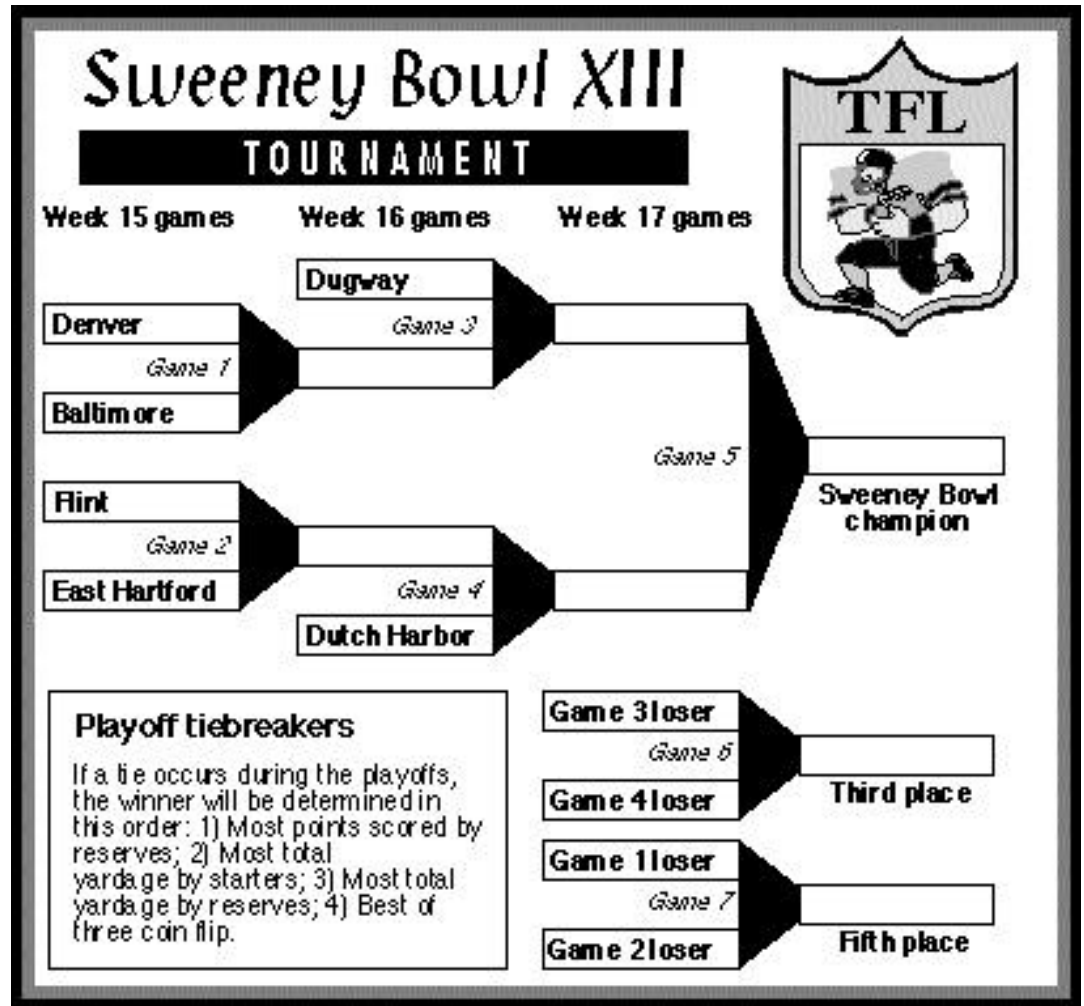
▲ Dugway, Denver, Baltimore and East Hartford are all former Sweeney Bowl participants, but only Denver has won a title.

▲ Dugway, Denver and Flint own the three best regular season records in TFL history. Flint was 13-1 in 1994, Denver 11-3 in 1991 and Dugway 11-3 this year.

▲ Dugway and Dutch Harbor are both in their third straight Sweeney Bowl Tournament.

The runaway favorite to win the T. Rex is the Dutch Harbor Dawgs, who rallied from way back to win the points scoring championship.

The Dawgs (9-5) have scored 128 points in their past two games and have scored a TFL record 95 points in a single game this year. The deadly



combination of RBs Barry Sanders and Dorsey Levens has made the one weakness in the Dutch Harbor lineup, quarterback, bearable.

And with Steve McNair getting all of Eddie George's rushing TDs, that's not even a weakness any more.

The Dawgs will face the winner of this week's quarterfi-

nal game between Flint (8-6) and East Hartford (8-6).

Flint was the hottest team in the league until losing to Marley 52-40 during the final regular season game.

In the other quarterfinal game, Baltimore (8-6) takes on Denver (9-5). The winner of that game meets regular season champion Dugway (11-3) in the

other semifinal game.

The latest odds in Las Vegas have Dutch Harbor as a 2-1 favorite to win the T. Rex. Dugway, which finished four points behind the Dawgs in the points race, is next at 5-1.

Flint is third at 7-1, Denver next at 8-1, Baltimore is next at 15-1 and East Hartford the 99-1 longshot.

# Newts look for history

## Bagdad aims for its first postseason victory

It may only be the Pee Wee Bowl, but at this point any victory in the postseason would be an accomplishment for Bagdad owner Scott Lacy.

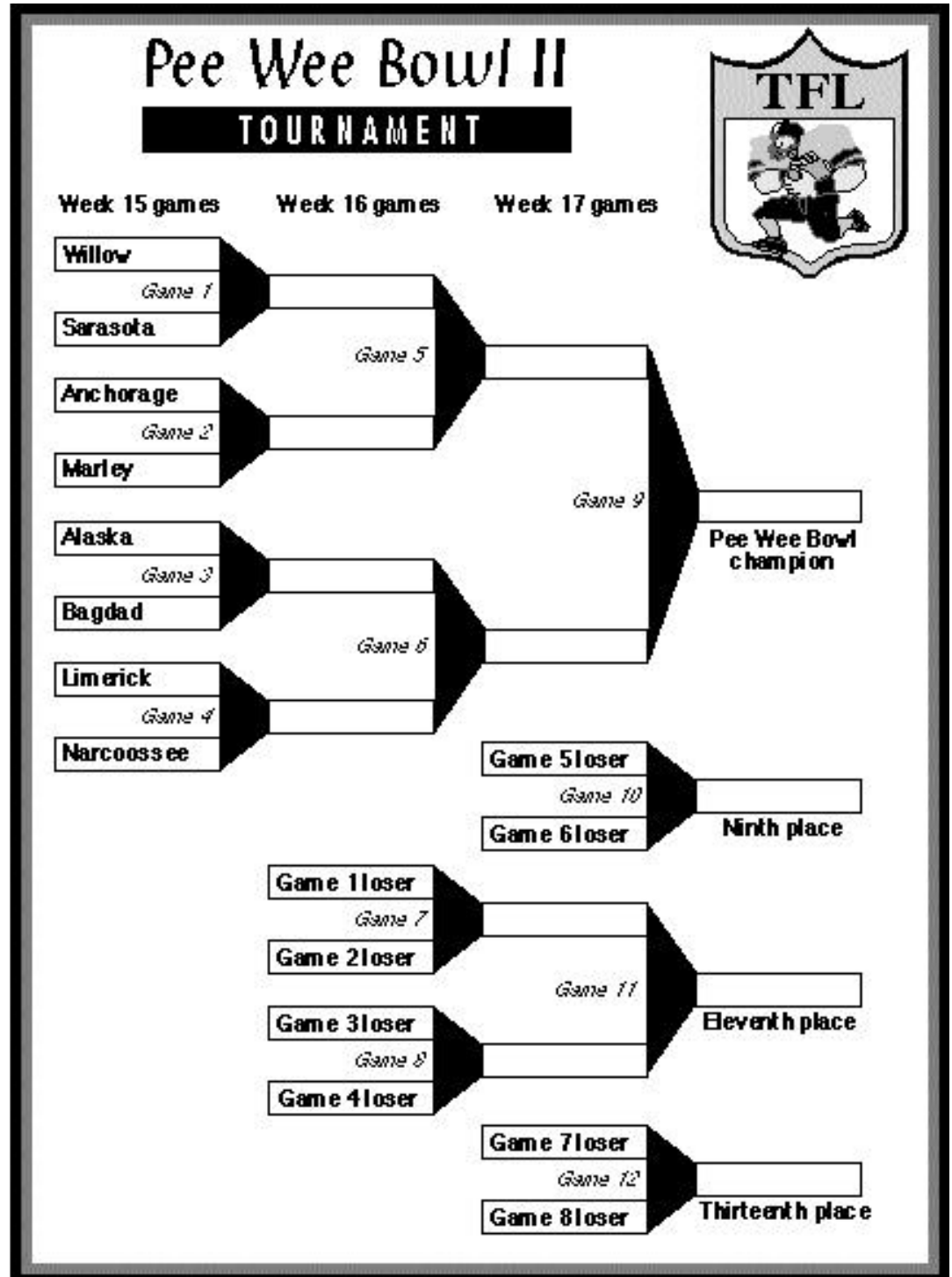
The Red-Bellied Newts are a dismal 0-8 in postseason play in the TFL.

After a 6-8 regular season, the Newts could not qualify for the Sweeney Bowl Tournament and will now get a chance to compete for the Paul Ruben Trophy in the second Pee Wee Bowl Tournament.

The 1996 Pee Wee champ, East Hartford, will not get a chance to defend his title. After a week of whining, league official pleaded with Alaska to defeat Willow so there would not be an international incident over the Ex-Eskimos — winners of five games when they scored 31 points or less — would miss the Sweeney Bowl Tournament.

Instead, East Hartford is the sacrificial lamb offered up to Sweeney Bowl favorites Flint and Dutch Harbor.

An interesting matchup looms in the semifinals. Bagdad may get a chance to renew its banana-war with Narcoossee, if both lose or win their first-round game.
