Next time Ken Sain and Chris Reidy go off on one of their Prop. 5 debates, just close your ears and walk away. Nothing they will say hasn't been said before.

What's that? Yes, I know that's not a secret. Here's the secret I'll reveal: The one factor, more than anything else, that determines which teams make the play-offs and which teams are Pee Wee bound.

All you have to do to find the secret is look at the Arctic Gators.

Shocked? You shouldn't be. They are the perfect example.

The No. 1 factor in determining the outcome of your fantasy football season is the strength of the schedule you play. Everything else, is window dressing.

That is why Flint's opponents have outscored his team by 16 points this season, and yet the Bison are a win away from clinching the regular-season title and the No. 1 seed in the play-offs.

And how does this all relate to the poor, pathetic Arctic Gators?

I'm glad you asked. Despite all the whining

from Sain, the unluckiest team in the TFL has been Arctic. True, that team is awful. But, no team has faced a harder schedule than Mark Dolan's Gators.

Since Dolan brought his Gators back to the TFL for the 1998 season, opponents are averaging a whopping 44.1 points per game against them. And that is over an amazing 55-game stretch.

Scott Lacy and his computer have shown if you score 35 or more points each week, you usually will win. Not the Gators.

Arctic opponents scored 616 points in 1998 (second most that season); 546 in 1999 (5th most); and 682 points in 2000, the most ever scored against one team in a season.

The Gators have given up 583 points this season, the most in the league.

Maybe you could blame Dolan for hiring Steve Spurrier as a team consultant for the lack of defense. But, this is fantasy football

and no owner can control how many points his or her opponent will score against them that week. It's a random draw.

Let's compare what the six teams that are about to play in the Sweeney Bowl Tournament would have done if they would have been unlucky enough to draw Arctic's schedule this year:

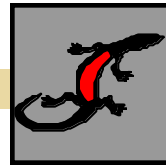

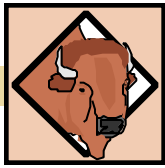


Alaska at Denver

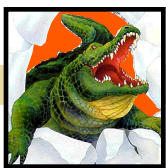


East Hartford at Flint

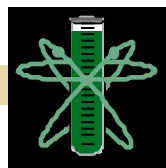

game since he made the trade with Dugway. He started Derrick Mason for five straight weeks while he was in a hospital. And no one understands why he continues to start Jacquez Green each season when the only time he sees the end zone is walking on and off the field.

The Gators are awful and richly deserve their record. Still, no team has suffered more from bad luck than Arctic. And the streak they are on is incredible.

What about karma?

Before the season began Dugway owner Sain said Lackawanna deserved a lot of bad karma for the rape trade. Well folks, karma is dead.

The Lancers have faced the easiest schedule, not only of this year, but perhaps of all time.

Opponents have scored only 359 points against Lackawanna this year. You have to go all the way back to 1990, back in the

dead ball days when points were very hard to come by, to even come close to that mark. The record for fewest points scored against in a season is 369 by Netherworld in 1990. As amazing as it sounds, Lackawanna could break that mark this week.

The Lancers are a pretty good bet to top the mark of 426 by Narcoossee in 1999, the lowest since the scoring surge began with the 1995 season.

If karma did exist, the Brothers Continelli would have been awarded Arctic's schedule instead of perhaps the easiest schedule in the history of the league.

Prop. 5 is dead

Well, relief is in sight.

Next season the TFL is scheduled to expand to 16 teams which will allow for true divisional play. Each team will play their divisional rivals twice.

That won't quite kill off the Prop. 5 argument, but it should limit its effectiveness.

Only three teams from

each conference will advance to the Sweeney Bowl Tournament under the current expansion committee plan.

That means, you better win your division if you want to advance.

If teams end up splitting the regular-season series, the next tie-breaker would be points scored.

I'm guessing there will be far more ties broken by total points than head-to-head with the new divisional format next season.

All about seeding

We're down to the final regular-season weekend. Here is where we stand as far as seedings.

Flint: Clinches the No. 1 seed in the Sweeney Tournament with a win.

Lackawanna: Needs to win and hope Flint loses to get No. 1 seed. If not, they get No. 4 seed.

Dutch Harbor: Has outside shot at No. 1 seed (if Flint and Lackawanna lose). Claims No. 2 seed with a win.

Alaska: Can claim No. 2 seed with a win and a Dutch Harbor loss. If not, could fit in at Nos. 3, 5 or 6.

Denver: Can finish no higher than No. 3. Only

needs to defeat Alaska to earn that. Could finish as low as No. 6.

Anchorage: Can finish no higher than No. 5.

In the Pee Wee tournament, seeding is a mess with so many teams having the same record. Still, we try to enlighten.

Narcoossee: Claims top see with a win or a Willow loss.

Willow: Needs to win and have Grape Apes lose to get top seed.

Limerick: Holds tie-breaker over Dugway if both win for the No. 3 seed.

Dugway: Can finish no higher than No. 3 seed.

The mess that is teams with a 4-9 record: Bagdad, Baltimore, East Hartford and Arctic are all tied with 4-9 records. Because of the chaos that could ensue if both Limerick and Dugway lose this week, there could be a massive tie with teams owning 5-9 records.

There are too many variables to try and figure out the seeding.

Any of the teams could end up at No. 3, or No. 8 in the Pee Wee

Tournament. That is, if anyone cares.

The Bison need a victory to clinch the title. Flint would also clinch if all three contenders lose. Lackawanna can clinch with a win and a Flint loss. Dutch Harbor currently leads in total points so the Dawgs would win the 5 percent of the pot and the No. 1 seed, earning a bye.

Sweeney Bowl byes

The **Kotter Division** winner (Flint or Lackawanna) will earn a bye. The other will be the No. 4 seed.

Dutch Harbor, winner of the **Horshack Division**, earns at least the No. 2 seed and a bye with a win this week. The Dawgs would also be awarded the No. 2 seed with a loss if Alaska loses as well.

Barbarino Division contenders Denver and Alaska play each other this week. The winner is the division champion. If the two teams tie this week, Denver wins the division crown. If Alaska wins, it could earn the No. 2 seed and the bye if Dutch Harbor loses.
