'Smos, Dicks: Brawl for it all

"I don't know that you could get a much better playoff game," a breathless Exmos owner Chris Reidy said at his postgame press conference. "Everything from watching Scott wriggle his way back from a 40-0 deficit, to Jason Elam's opening bomb of a field goal, to the Rod Smith 'immaculate deception' play ... I mean, just incredible."

The Exmos, who had the league's best record at 12-2, had closed the season in the grip of an icy points drought. They seemed ripe to continue the record of futility shown by TFL regular season champions: The eight previous teams to finish with the best record were 0-8 in their playoff openers, one of the more onerous streaks in TFL history.

But hold on, folks. Another streak will follow in its wake next week. While four previous points champions (for years records are available) have advanced to the Sweeney Bowl, none have won it. So this will mark the first time either the regular season or points champion has won all the money.

"Once again, we're on the cusp of history," Reidy said. "But not so close that we don't remember a little RECENT history."

That would refer to Week 6, when the 5-0 Exmos, who seemed to be dog sledding to a battle-ofunbeatens matchup with the Newts, instead found themselves trampled 83-43 by the rampaging Dicks.

Bingham's draft -- which drew more than one guffaw at the TFL Convention -- ultimately resulted in 675 points, second-most in TFL history. And dealing a second stinging blow to the Exmos, Alaska edged East Hartford by two for the '98 points title.

"There's not much to say about that game," Reidy said. "Maybe we got caught looking ahead to that Battle of Bagdad. Rest assured, no one's looking down their nose at the Dicks any more."

The league awaits the rematch. If it's even half as dramatic as the two semifinals, it will be a Sweeney Bowl for the ages.

The Dicks were softened up by the late-charging Dutch Harbor Dawgs, but had enough staying power for a 40-34 victory. A late interception return for a touchdown by the Vikings defense -- the last "player" for either team -- turned out to be the winning score.

The Newts, after crawling out of the waters of playoff futility onto the dry land of a quarterfinal victory, found themselves trailing the Exmos 40-0 with four players left. But Randall Cunningham and Gary Anderson, playing in the Sunday night game, steadily cut into that deficit until only five points separated the teams going into the Monday night game.

Elam, once more rewarding Reidy for picking him in the third round, gave the Exmos some breathing room with a five-point field goal. But late in the first half, John Elway scrambled toward the end zone before the ball slipped from his grasp like a salamander. Smith pounced on it in the end zone. Although Elam salvaged a point, the Exmos' lead was down to 46-41.

"I didn't know what to think at that point," Reidy said. "I mean, Scott Lacy INVENTED the 'Monday Night Miracle.' And that play was nothing short of miraculous."

However, Elam would add one more field goal, giving the Exmos an eight-point cushion, and one receiving point from Smith (Lacy's other Monday nighter, Karim Abdul-Jabbar, was shut out) left the Exmos with a narrow 49-42 victory.

"I think Scott proved why his team is consistently one of the best," Reidy said. "Shaking that 0-11 tag should remove any doubt anyone ever had about that. And he came a newt's eyelash from getting to the big game.

"That was one hell of a team we just beat. I can only hope the experience toughens us up for the Dicks."

But their improbable, admirable, semi-remote-control season was buoyed (actually *carried*) during a




