But he has either been too busy flying around the world and back for work, or partying in New York, to be able to chronicle any of it himself, so we thought we'd point these things out for him.

The Apes did so much right at the draft, not much was necessary after that as far as constructing a team, apart from the vulturish snatching of Charlie Garner and Duce Staley one day after the Barons waived each players.

Even though Favre's season more or less fizzled, and he only has 20 touchdown passes, Harrison's stellar numbers (see next page) kept Narcoossee in clover.

But it is symptomatic of these two teams' seasons, as it probably is of most other leagues, that the development of the Indianapolis Colts' offen-

sive machinery had much to say about how people's seasons went, and may well have the final say in the championship game.

Harrison's hookups with Peyton Manning buoyed Narcoossee for much of the season. But the white-hot rookie year of James eventually led the Colts' attack to undergo a progression from aerial to balanced, stealing some thunder during the second half of the season from owners of Manning and Harrison in general, and giving wings to any owners of James.

And what a battle it promises to be this week.

Unfortunately the media relations desk at Lackawanna headquarters was also pretty quiet this week, so we'd have to make something up to get a quote out of the Brothers C.

"We're happy to be here," Mike Continelli probably would have said. We'll assume he's being ultra-conservative in his remarks so as not to fire the Apes up.

It's a Sweeney Bowl with a lot at stake and promises to be one to remember.

We just hope Tuttell has time to watch it.

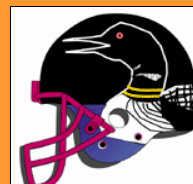

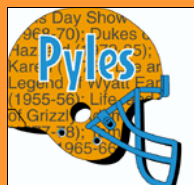

getting Kurt Warner prior to its week 5 game with Baltimore, and getting studly numbers out of him but disappointing numbers from the rest of its lineup for most of the season.

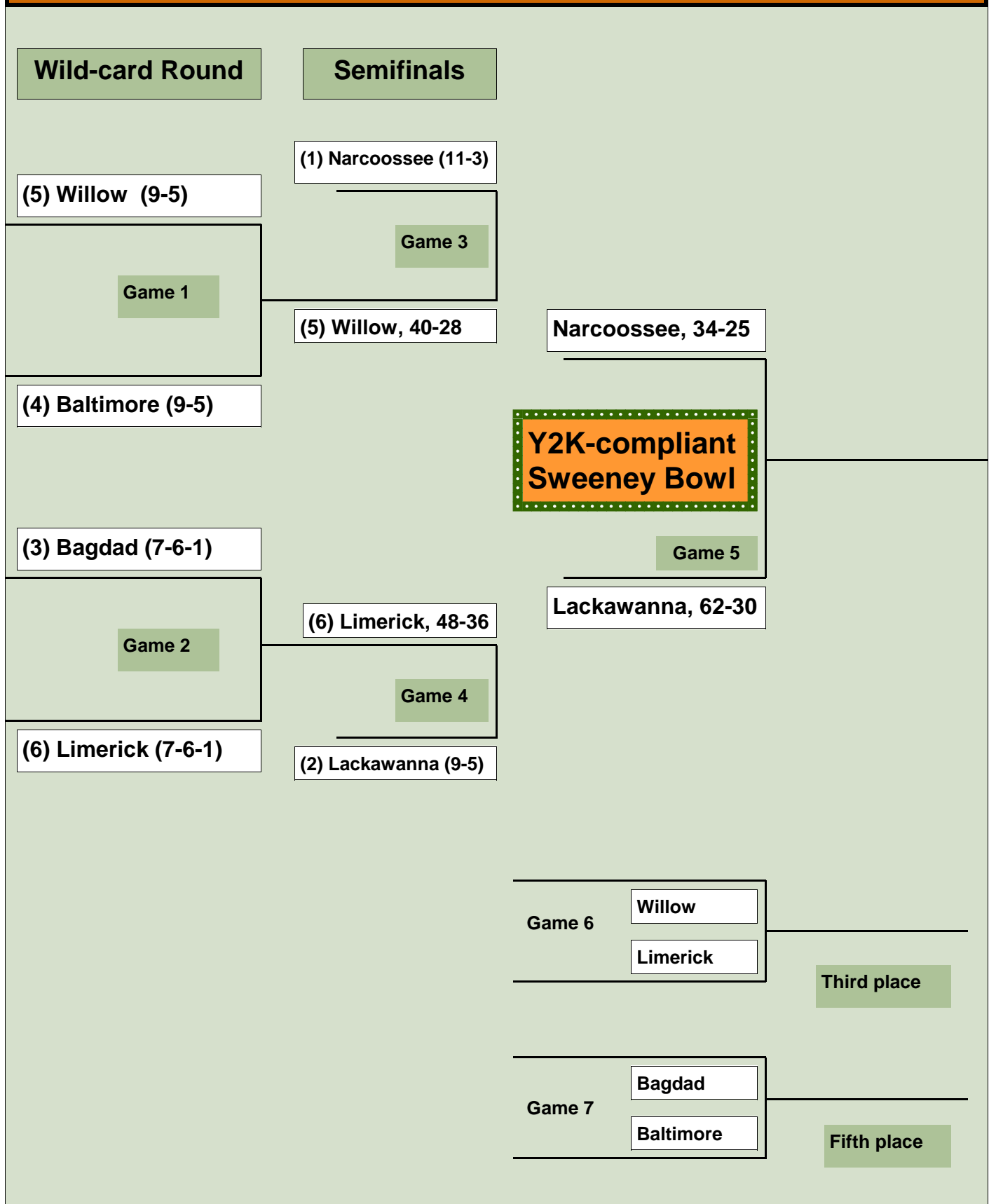

Now, uh, what could 3 percent buy?

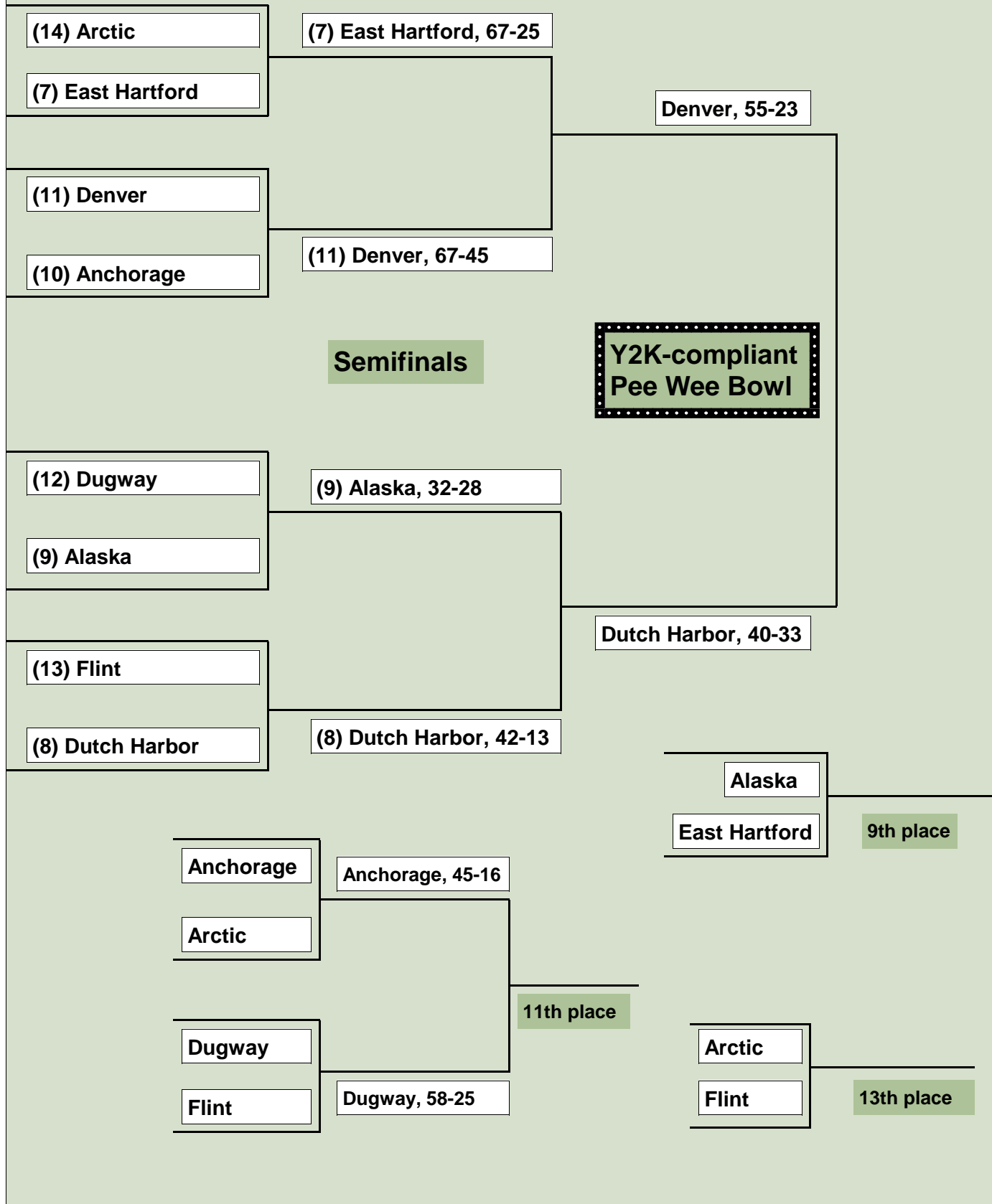
